

WHEREAS, art education develops students' creative potential and improves problem-solving and critical thinking skills; and

WHEREAS, art education teaches sensitivity to beauty, order, and other expressive qualities, and also gives students a deeper understanding of multi-cultural values and beliefs; and

We ALL must contribute to the absolutely essential and varied world of art to see it continue to grow and flourish.
