Special recognition has been awarded to Elise Pelletier, Scarborough High School Visual Arts Educator and Youth Art Month Statewide Coordinator for the Maine Arts Education Association (MAEA), for her individual contribution to the promotion of youth art throughout Maine during the month of March in 2019. Pelletier is being recognized for her work organizing the Youth Art Month student exhibit at the Portland Museum of Art (PMA). The year 2019 marked the 25th anniversary of the Portland Museum of Art's and the Maine Arts Education Association's Youth Art Month annual student exhibit. 108 works of art representing Kindergarten through 12th grade students across the State of Maine were on display as a result of the collaboration of Elise Pelletier,

MAEA Youth Art Month Chairperson, and Meghan Quigley of the PMA. The Council for Art Education (CFAE) will recognize Pelletier amongst 22 Youth Art Month program awardees nationwide during the 2020 National Art Education Association (NAEA) Convention to be held in Minneapolis, Minnesota, on March 26-28. Stephen Amoroso, art teacher at Fairview Elementary School in Auburn, Maine, celebrates his 22nd year teaching art by expanding his own creative art education repertoire at local open mic stand up comedy locations, planning cool art adventures for his students, and by presenting student art to support the importance of arts education. Amoroso feels that, "If I can get them excited and curious about art and expression and creativity then they will look forward to exploring it further at the upper grades, as well as pursuing it on their own."

Mikayla Richards, his 6th grade student at Fairview Elementary School has artwork on display at the Capitol Complex in Augusta through April 30th, 2020. Richards' artist statement expresses her excitement for art: "I like having the ability to create something. I always had a passion for art." Her work of a pinecone showing shading is drawn with the continuous line contour technique, wherein the student does not lift the pencil during the entire process of the drawing and cannot go back in later to edit it with an eraser. 2020 SAVING ENDANGERED SPECIES YOUTH ART CONTEST Entries Due: March 1st

Elementary, middle and high school teachers and their students are encouraged to participate in the 2020 Saving Endangered Species Youth Art Contest, an integral part of the 15th annual Endangered Species Day, celebrated on May 15, 2020.

Entries should depict a land or ocean-dwelling species that either lives in or migrates through the United States and its waters and has been placed on the threatened/endangered species list. Artwork must be submitted electronically by March 1, 2020.

Winners will be chosen in four categories: K-Grade 2, Grades 3-5, Grades 6-8 and Grades 912, and will receive plaques and art supply gift packs (from Chartpak Inc.). In addition, one grand prize winner will be honored at a reception in Washington, D.C. in May 2020 and also receive a special art lesson from a professional artist.


