*Ticket to Ride provides funding to defray the cost of travel for Maine schools wishing to visit Maine arts based venues and events as part of a well-rounded curriculum. The goals of the travel should support student learning and be aligned with the visual and/or performing arts standards. Applications are accepted throughout the year. Funding will be made available approximately one month after an application is submitted. Schools may apply more than once a year as long as they are applying to attend a different event, bringing a different student population, or have not expended their eligible amount.*

The Saco Museum is currently exhibiting a show entitled, *It's Natural: Art by Art Teachers*. Thornton Academy visual art teachers Jennifer Merry and Dana Altman have works in the show, along with my own mixed media encaustic pieces entitled *Traveling Fools I* and *Traveling Fools II*. Dana Altman also has mixed media encaustic work on display. Dana and I attended a weekend workshop last fall at the Haystack Mountain School where we produced the art. Jennifer Merry has photography and mixed media pieces in the show. Jennifer's photos are from her travels, and her mixed media piece is a collage of work produced by her and her two sons at different times in their lives.

All works on display were produced by art teachers, including Justine Frapier who student taught with Thomas at Thornton.

Congratulations ladies on a wonderful show! The Thornton Academy community is fortunate to have such dedicated artists as teachers.

The Opening reception for *It's Natural: Art by Art Teachers* was very well attended on Saturday, February 1, 2020. Over 80 people stopped by to experience the vibrant color found in over 60 artworks created by 35 members of MAEA. As these two educators are encouraging students to bring stylized imagery to the halls of Lewiston High School, the student ownership of the mural project resonates loudly and positively through the school even on a day when it is open to district educators and their professional development.

The mural program is emboldening student voice and embracing cultural diversity while presenting the opportunity for students to lead the way, become excited about the content and process, teach one another from different fine arts classes and newcomers to the program, and increase attendance for some struggling students. Laura told participants: "Our school is here because of our students. We want them to feel relevant." The students work on the murals without direct oversight once content and placement is approved. Many utilize study hall time to complete the murals in addition to class time. Each student works toward refining each project through revisions as detected through self-reflection and peer or educator conferencing.

As educators passed through the hallways of the InspirED camp at Lewiston High School, each could find students completing paintings on

murals in six different areas of the school.

Deanna states that additional ideas of future murals are also working "in our brains"...educator brains and student brains. One educator at the high school noted, "these are things the students can walk through and be proud of." Deanna does not have the students sign their murals as they are "for everyone." Student pride does not stay with the artists alone, but transfers to many students attending the high school. Deanna feels starting with a "safe concept" of the school mascot and invoking community pride is what opened the door for adding additional murals with deeper meaning that invoked discussion among peers and educators themselves. Noting that these murals are "somewhat temporary," in that, as the school culture changes so might these murals be repainted to reflect those changes. These two fine arts educators have defined Lewiston High School's building as a "living, breathing entity."
