As such, this document was adapted from a shared resource organized by Amy Bultena, Visual and Performing Arts & STEAM Coordinator at Stanislaus County Office of Education, CA. Media Arts content was contributed by Alice Gentili. The new guide includes the recommended grade band level Individual Student Art Supply Kit sets and definitions of educational scenarios adapted from the visual arts section of the Arts Ed New Jersey publication, "September Ready: Fall 2020 Guidance for Arts Education". Once the additional comments from additional Maine art educators are completed, we will publish the MAEA COVID-19 Visual Arts Classroom Management and Safety Suggestions document to the MAEA website.
