

In my President's Message in October, I mentioned four goals I have as MAEA President: Communication/Connection, ED&I, Professional Growth, and Leadership. I'd like to use this month's *Mixed Media* issue to talk about the work the MAEA is doing on Equity, Diversity, & Inclusion. As a state organization, we're committed to constant reflection, examining our role in societal shifts, and taking action where we can to create meaningful change. To that end, we created the first MAEA ED&I Committee and the LGBTQIA+ Interest Group, who collaborated on seeking out diverse Maine artists to hire for conferences and workshops. The work they do to promote social and climate justice through art education is beyond inspirational—you won't want to miss their presentation at the PMA YAM event on Saturday March 9th.



MAEA WINTER LEADERSHIP RETREAT

In the midst of the damaging rainstorm on January 13th, several MAEA members gathered at Brunswick Junior High to enjoy an artmaking session of MAEA Creates and a delicious potluck lunch followed by some intense and productive big-picture thinking and planning. The work set the stage for developing a specific five-year plan with defined goals for the organization.

To begin our planning, we brainstormed on sticky notes what we each saw as the pillars or purposes of the MAEA. Our answers fell into four overlapping categories:



After analyzing our current strengths in each of these categories, we identified the areas with room for growth. Then we prioritized what we felt were the top three issues MAEA should focus on as an organization (see box to right). These will become the basis of our five-year plan.
