

Portland Museum of Art Youth Art Month Has Gone Virtual

For almost 30 years, the Portland Museum of Art and the Maine Art Education Association (MAEA) have collaborated to bring National Youth Art Month to Maine. We are happy to announce that this tradition continues. This year marks the first time that **Youth Art Month at the PMA will be digital.**

This annual exhibition emphasizes the value of art education and encourages support for quality school art programs through a month-long exhibition of artwork by K-12 students throughout the state. The exhibition will begin digitally on March 1, 2021 on the PMA's website.

Registration will be open from 9 a.m. Wednesday, January 20, 2021 through 5 p.m. Wednesday, February 24, 2021.



To submit student work, you must be a **current member of MAEA**. Check your membership status, email membership chair Hope Lord before completing the online registration.

You may submit one artwork per teacher per school.

Artwork created by multiple students or work with multiple teachers is not permitted.

Artwork must be photographed properly (see our Guidelines for Photographing Artwork) and will only be accepted if proper protocol is followed.

Because it is a virtual exhibition, we hope that teachers submit a wide array of media. **2D**, **3D**, **animation**, **short film and video** are all able to be submitted. We also will be accepting artist statements.



MONHEGAN ARTISTS RESIDENCY

Eligibility

The Monhegan Artists' Residency Program is open to visual artists who live in, or have significant ties to the state of Maine. Artists working in all visual art media including painting, drawing, sculpture, printmaking, photography, digital, video, or other new media, are welcome to apply. Applicants must be at least 21 years of age and not enrolled in a degree program.

2021 Residency Dates:

Saturday, July 2 - Friday July 16 (only for K-12 Maine art teachers)

2021 Jurors:

Lisa Pixley - Artist, founder of Pickwick Press (2009); recipient of Maine Arts Commission, Good Idea Grant (2012); teaches art at the University of New England (2014-present); currently runs Printcraft, a print shop and retail space in Portland.

Dylan Metrano - Papercutting artist and graphic designer; exhibits his work in Maine, New Hampshire, and Massachusetts; musician; recently moved from Monhegan to Bath, where he and his wife run La Nef Chocolate, which they started on Monhegan in 2018.

Alexis lammarino - Interdisciplinary artist based in mid-coast Maine; her training as a dancer and choreographer informs her current collaborative studio practice as a mural artist, curator, and educator at Steel House and the lead artist/educator at CMCA's ArtLab in Rockland.

Application Process

The submission deadline is March 19, 2021.
