that is now decorated with colorful shapes to a cake decorated to look like a unicorn!!! I guess, what I'm trying to say is, anything can be art! So go ahead artists, and put yourself out there! Because the truth is, anyone can be an artist!

Rockland, ME, October 2, 2020 — The Center for Maine Contemporary Art (CMCA) in Rockland will host a full-day professional workshop for Maine art educators in partnership with the Maine Arts Education Association (MAEA) on Saturday, October 17 from 9:30am to 3:30pm. Pre-registration for the workshop is required, participants may register at cmcanow.org.

The daylong workshop "Activating Hybrid Learning with Contemporary Art" will look to diverse themes and artworks in the CMCA 2020 Biennial to discover a range of artmaking processes and ideas to heighten curriculum and personal practice. CMCA staff will lead participants through a gallery tour, hands-on activities and informational sessions on concepts and techniques for incorporating contemporary art into classrooms, both in-person and online. The event will conclude with a Biennial artist talk.

I thank each of you that responded to our recent survey, "COVID-19 Visual and Media Arts Program Impact", concerning our return to visual arts programs here in our Maine public school system. 69% of the programs participating in the survey have altered the delivery of art programs. Our hope here at the MAEA is that soon 100% of our original arts programs will return to the "norm" as those

19% that have not altered in delivery other than to provide a different kind of "safe" distancing and cleaning during the time of COVID. Being "very grateful to have a full time job still" and working through medical concerns with few or no accommodations is difficult on your own. While many members currently feel that our programs and educators have been "placed on the back burner", I promise that the MAEA is not alone in supporting our districts as together we wait out and weave through the CDC and DHHS guidelines for the safe implementation of public school programming. As you continue to arrive at your schools with every positive of your nature every day, Jason Anderson, Visual and Performing Arts Specialist of the Maine Department of Education, is working hard to promote your well-being - both for our programs and for ourselves. I am pleased to announce that Susan Potters of the ABC Coalition has continued to advocate for the arts in Maine throughout our State's ordeal. Her brightest demeanor continues to shine and inspire all around us as we each dig in locally and bring light to the students we support.
